"Grading of ITIs" scheme has been launched by MSDE to establish a quality assurance mechanism for both Government and Private ITIs. The objective of conducting grading of ITIs is to provide "star rating" to the institutes on a scale of 0 to 5. The grading of ITIs is a voluntary exercise for both Government and Private ITIs.

- 2. Scoring has been done based on 43 defined parameters under 10 major heads. The composite score of the institute reflects its current performance level. Additionally, parameter wise score will enable ITIs to find out the key areas where they can improve resulting in overall improved performance of ITIs.
- 3. Grading of ITIs is a three step process starting with online submission of self-rating by the respective ITI followed by physical verification/data validation by 3rd party independent auditor M/s CRISIL. The final rating score has been assigned by Core Grading committee.
- 4. It is pertinent to mention that the score assigned by M/s CRISIL was shared with the respective ITIs. The ITIs were given a chance to submit their grievances, in case they were not satisfied by 3rd party rating. The Grievance Committee consisting of State Directorate and DGT officials looked into the grievances and accordingly the ITI rating was rectified.

5. The grading for the self-rated ITIs has been finalized and the Status for the state of West Bengal is as follows:-

- 6. The detailed ITI Grading sheet has been shared with the State Director and State Nodal Officer. The ratings for ITIs has also been uploaded on NCVT MIS portal under ITI login, as well as published on DGT website.
- 7. The Grading score of ITIs is going to play an important role in incentivizing of ITIs under various schemes. Hence, it may be useful for the State Government to take interest in the grading and review the outcomes of the efforts made by DGT and sensitize ITIs and Directorate on Grading of ITIs.
